

Cindy Ellis is a Cuban-American choral conductor and jazz vocalist who serves as the middle school choral director and a high school choral director at Miami Arts Studio, a 6–12 public performing arts magnet in Miami, Florida. Her award-winning ensembles have performed at major venues and events including Carnegie Hall, American Choral Directors Association State, Regional, and National Conferences, and the 2022 Summit of the Americas, with students recording for the Latin GRAMMYs and American Music Awards and collaborating with artists such as Gloria Estefan and Jacob Collier, including his 2024–2025 world tours.

As a performer, Ellis has appeared at the Kennedy Center, Lincoln Center, NBC's *Saturday Night Live*, and the BBC Proms Festival in London. She holds music education degrees from Florida International University and the University of Missouri, contributes to music education publications, and is a guest clinician across North America.

Ellis was named Miami Arts Studio's 2025 Teacher of the Year and a 2025 and 2026 GRAMMY Music Educator Award semifinalist. Most recently, her top high school women's ensemble, Bellarmonia, was on the 2026 GRAMMY ballot for Best Choral Performance. Under Ellis' direction, Bellarmonia is scheduled to perform at the 2026 TED International Conference and will be representing the United States at the 2026 Gyeongnam International Choral Festival in Busan, South Korea.
